## Removing Code-Based Sandbox Solutions in SharePoint Online

Starting at the end of July, Microsoft has begun removing code-based sandbox solutions in SharePoint Online. As part of the removal process, activation of new code-based sandbox solutions, as well as updates of existing solutions are no longer available. In the coming weeks, running code-based sandbox solutions in SharePoint Online multi-tenant environments also will be disabled. Customers with these solutions should watch the Message Center and Service Health Dashboard (SHD) for details, timelines, and exception processes.
