In June, Microsoft released a couple of minor but not insignificant improvements to Access. Read more about them in this post [What's new in Access 2016](#). My favorite is the associating of a Label control with another control via a new field. I actually did not know that you could do this manually by cutting an existing label and pasting it onto the control you wanted to associate it to. Apparently even after 15+ years working with the product, you can still learn new tricks! I certainly have found it frustrating in the past to add a label that moves with a control at any time other than at the time you create the control. Now it will be a snap!
